
ABOUT BOB BEERS | HARD WORK AND HEART.

Bob Beers is a Nevadan. He moved to the state with his parents at age 11, grew up in both southern and northern Nevada, and became a community and civic leader in a time of need.

He never intended to become an elected official. In 1998, a retiring assemblywoman encouraged Bob to run for her Assembly District 4 seat. She knew Nevada could use someone with his background and he handily won his first election.

Bob went on to be one of the most active and dedicated legislators in the Assembly. He was one of few freshman legislators to ever serve on the Assembly Ways and Means Committee and the first minority freshman to chair a subcommittee.

Bob was responsible for many improvements within state government, enhancing resident services while reducing the

There were less than a half-million people in the state when the Beers family first moved to Nevada. Clark County had less than 250,000. Washoe County had less than 150,000. It was a different era, one that all lifelong Nevadans are proud of.

Like many families, the Beer's family came to Nevada for the promise of a better quality of life and future. Frank Beer's relocated to work at the Nevada Test Site as an engineer. Bob's mother, Pat, took a job as a schoolteacher and later became a licensed Marriage and Family Therapist.

While they did not block the tax hike, residents in Bob's district encouraged him to run against a 20-year incumbent for the State Senate. Despite being outspent nearly 3-to-1, Bob won the election.

In the State Senate, Bob worked to repeal the tax increase, redirect "pork" spending to reduce payroll taxes and create jobs, and improve education. He was also the first to call for a state tax surplus refund, encouraging Governor Kenny Guinn to return \$300 million to taxpayers.

This win for Nevadans helped Bob become the voice of accountable government and a trusted advisor on matters related to the state budget, staving off recessionary pressures for two more years. He also increased the homestead exemption, saving hundreds of homeowners from foreclosure.

He planned to do more in his second term. Unfortunately, Bob was falsely accused of being under review by the state Ethics Commission during his re-election campaign, which cost him the election. Bob was later exonerated when the opposition admitted

Like his father, Bob was very active in school and in his community. He was a Boy Scout who took an early interest in music, ham radio, and the outdoors. In 1977, he graduated from Clark High School with honors and spent a few years in northein Nevada while attending the University of Nevada, Reno (UNR).

While studying journalism at UNR, Bob began working as a disc jockey and newsman for KCBN and KRNO in Reno. The station offered him the chance to become the youngest radio news director in the history of the state. Not long after, he married his high school sweetheart, Sarah, before returning to Las Vegas to work for radio stations KLUC and KMJJ and complete his degree at the University of Nevada, Las Vegas (UNLV).

While raising a family in Las Vegas, Bob graduated with distinction from UNLV in 1987 and became a certified public accountant. In 1995 and 1996, Bob was named a "Top 40 Under 40" business leader by the Las Vegas Business Press. His first accounting and software company — Wilson, Beers and Alu — was bought by large regional CPA firm.

In 2009, he purchased a struggling firm and brought it into feeral compliance with the help of former Nevada Treasurer Bob Seale. They renamed the firm Seale and Beers, CPAs, and recruited former Deloitte accountants as partners.

Bob's wife Sarah works for the Clark County Department of F⁻ Ny Services. She and Bob have two adult children, Lindsey, age 25
